# General Presentment and Reports Athens-Clarke County Grand Jury First Quarter Session 2023

On the ninth day of January 2023 the Honorable Judge Lawton Stephens selected a jury of 25 people including two alternates to the grand jury. Judge Lawton Stephens then administered the oath and charged them with their responsibilities.

The jurors then elected Deborah Lynn Wilson as Foreperson, Melissa Crowe as Assistant Foreperson, Danielle Celeste Martin as Secretary, and Ada Kathryn Clouden as Assistant Secretary.

The remaining Jurors were Emily Aguilar-Pedraza, Matthew Bengochea, Jocilyn Boyd, Della Mae Clark, Kristina Clark, Vickie Cofer, LeQuincy Cooper, Zachary Crew, Mauricio Ferrer-Comparan, Ansley Guntermann, Gloria Hill, Emory Johnson Jr., Nancy R. Johnson, David Harrison Mitchell, Jr., Maria Ortega, Marianne Palmer, Jessica Sutherland, Tina Teasley, and Denzel Thomas. Alternate jurors were Darrell Appling and Charles Wesley Sorrells. Charles Wesley was excused by Assistant District Attorney Page Otwell for medical reasons on January 18, 2023.

### **Criminal Functions**

The Grand Jury was presented with 78 cases. Of these cases 75 were True Bills, 0 were No Bills, and 3 were returned as split bills. This activity took place January 10<sup>th</sup>, January 31<sup>st</sup>, February 7<sup>th</sup>, February 28<sup>th</sup>, March 21<sup>st</sup>, March 28<sup>th</sup>, and April 4<sup>th</sup>. Unfortunately, on January the 24<sup>th</sup> we had to cancel due to having seven jurors call out and having five jurors that were a no call/no show. This incident was regrettable to all.

### **Civil Functions**

We were presented with a document from Beverly Logan, Clerk of Court regarding the destruction of copies of voter ballots from past elections. It was discussed and voted to approve the destruction of the ballots according to the Board of Election's standard procedures.

Additionally, we were presented with a Board of Equalization document from Beverly Logan, Clerk of Court which stated due to the Department of Revenue's rules on education Patricia M. Murray would need to complete specific training in the calendar year. We were notified she has completed such training and after discussion we feel Patricia M. Murray should be reappointed as Clarke County Board of Equalization and be reappointed to fulfill her unexpired term.

As previously stated by other members of the grand jury we would like to suggest that the witness chair provided for officers be a chair without arms. Most officers came in full uniform, and it was difficult for them to sit comfortably in full gear and therefore some even stood throughout their presentation of the case.

# **Closing Remarks**

In the democratic process, our call to duty as a juror is one of the most important civic roles we will play outside of the voting booth. To many, this has been the first time to experience the right of due process for those accused of a crime. While hearing the presentation by officers and others, we realize how much they sacrifice on a daily basis, and we gained an understanding of how emotionally draining some cases may be on them.

We would also ask that the state consider raising the compensation rate jurors are given from \$35 a session to \$50 a session. This increase would help those who do not get paid by their employers for time missed.
